General Information

Each day your child will need to bring in their red book bag, a labelled water bottle and a coat.

Expected Homework

Reading — the children will bring home a different Little Wandle book each Thursday to read at least 4
times over the week. Please complete the reading record after your child has read. This provides a
dialogue between home and school about their progress and next steps in their learning.

Optional Homework

There will be a menu of termly optional homework tasks on the class web page. All activities are linked to our learning in class so it's a great way for your child to deepen their knowledge and understanding of the subjects we're covering. Please encourage your child to complete these tasks and they can bring in their work to celebrate. Alternatively, you can upload any work they have produced to Tapestry.

Phonics

This half term we will be moving on to our Phase 3 journey where we will begin to introduce the children to more complex graphemes through digraphs and trigraphs. We will also be learning more tricky words which are words that cannot be sounded out but must be read automatically.

In the second half term, we will not be learning any new sounds or tricky words but consolidating and embedding the sounds we have learnt to decode new and unfamiliar words. We will review our phase 3 graphemes and begin to read words with double letters, longer words with two or more digraphs, words ending in -ing and compound words.

Pathways to Write

We have a books-based approach to the teaching of writing and we choose books that will inspire, entertain and excite our children. This half term's reading can be found on our class page. We ask that you don't read these books in advance as it's lovely to discover them together. It's also important that we can develop their prediction skills which is difficult it they already know the book!

Core text for Spring 1: Let's All Creep Through Crocodile Creek by Jonny Lambert which will lead us to create our own non-chronological report on crocodiles.

Core text for Spring 2: The Pirates are Coming! by John Condon which will inspire us to structure and write a letter.

Alongside this, we will be delving into the world of poetry and continuing to create a language rich based environment through other reading materials.

Maths

Counting backwards 10-1

Ordering numbers 10-1

Splitting and recombining sets of objects 6-9.

Religious Education

We will be finding out about other cultures such as Chinese New Year and sharing in traditional celebrations during this time. Jack the Dog will be supporting us with more stories All about Jesus including recalling key aspects of the Easter story.

<u>PE</u>

Our PE kit is red school logo PE shirt/plain red t-shirt, black shorts/joggers and pumps/trainers. Football kit should not be worn. This half term we will be focusing on gymnastics. We will be developing our balance, agility and co-ordination and learning how to balance and move around/on the apparatus in the hall under control. In the second half term, we will be exploring different striking apparatus and attempt to hit a ball

towards a given direction. On your child's PE day, they should come to school in their kit and remain in it for the whole day.

How you can support at home...

- Read, read! Please continue to read as much as possible with your child to develop their fluency (not sounding out). A useful tip to enhance children's comprehension skills is to use the starter sentence 'I know that because...' When reading at home you might get the answer "I don't know" to a question but keep encouraging your child to reread to support these useful skills. They do know it, but may need more practise. Rereading for fluency is key!
- Continue to support writing in different contexts. For example, writing in birthday cards, forming letters in glitter/sand/flour or using the laminated whiteboard to practise the different actions for each letter.
- All the activities on the optional home menu can be downloaded from our class page. We'd recommend
 encouraging your child to choose from the menu the activities can be done in any order and at any
 point during the term so they have opportunities to deepen their understanding and practise their
 skills.
