

At Tarporley CE Primary we are committed to working with parents and guardians to help our pupils to be as successful as possible in all they do. We ask you to sign our partnership agreement to emphasis the importance of working together. Thank you.

Introduction

This agreement should be read in conjunction with the information given to parents on their child/children joining the school and at the beginning of each new school year.

All children benefit from a good relationship between home and school and at Tarporley Church of England Primary School we are committed to developing such relationships.

At the start of each new school year, class teachers and their pupils agree a class charter to sit alongside our 'Golden Rules'*, stating the desired behaviours we as a school expect, and we ask that parents support this.

As a school our aims are:

- Create an enjoyable, safe and nurturing ethos that allows all individuals to develop spiritually, morally and socially.
- Promote caring, sensitive and inclusive attitudes where individuals feel confident, secure, valued and respected by others.
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum which challenges, celebrates and develops the potential of each child.
- Create a stimulating environment, which encourages enthusiasm for lifelong learning and promotes an expectation of high standards.
- Develop a successful and lasting partnership between home, school, the Church and the wider community.

These create the ethos in which we want our pupils to grow and flourish and they represent our values as a school community.

*The school has five "Golden Rules" which were created by the children. These Rules are:

- Think before you act and speak
- Respect everyone and everything
- Try your best and never give up
- Be safe and keep others safe
- Remember your manners

TARPORLEY CE PRIMARY SCHOOL Home School Partnership Agreement

Together we will:

- Work closely together to tackle any issues relating to a child's learning, behaviour or well being
- Encourage children to show respect and tolerance for other children and adults
- Support and encourage children's learning to help them achieve their best, whatever their potential or needs

The school will:

- Provide a safe, secure and happy environment
- Encourage all children to do their best at all times and aim for high standards
- Encourage all children to take good care of their surroundings and others around them
- Provide a broad, balanced and challenging curriculum, including moral and spiritual development, which nurtures and develops the potential of each child
- Inform parents of their child's progress at regular meetings
- Foster caring and sensitive attitudes ensuring that each individual feels confident, secure, valued and respected by others
- Inform parents about school activities through the school website, emails, newsletters text messages, and notices about special events

Pupils will:

- Attend school regularly
- Be punctual
- Be organised bringing the necessary kit, resources, take home letters, lunchboxes etc. promptly
- Conduct themselves in an orderly manner, respecting the 'Golden Rules' and the agreed class charter
- Take increasing responsibility for their own learning
- Follow the school behaviour policy and 'Golden Rules'

Parents will:

- Respect and support the Christian distinctiveness of our church school
- Ensure children attend school in good health, regularly and punctually
- Provide support for the behaviour policy within the school and for the teacher's role
- Be realistic about their children's abilities and offer encouragement and praise
- Participate in discussions concerning their child's progress and attainment
- Ensure early contact with school to discuss matters which affect the child's happiness, progress and behaviour
- Inform school immediately of any suspected, confirmed or pre-existing medical conditions that may affect the health and well-being of your child or others in school
- Send children to school wearing the correct uniform and properly equipped with a full PE kit and anything else they may need
- Give due importance to homework, reading, sharing books and assisting in the learning of tables and spellings
- Hear / encourage children to read every day and record in their reading records / home school link book
- Allow their children to take increasing responsibility for their learning and behaviour as they move through the school
- Encourage children to develop 'life skills' that will support their journey through primary school and onto high school

- Adhere to the Parent Code of Conduct at all times
- Respect and support staff and school policies, and uphold the ethos of the school


